Indicator Definition and How it was Calculated:

2017/2018 academic year and 113 new students.

Persistence is defined by percent of new students who enrolled in at least one of the next two sessions after their initial enrollment in the 2023 calendar year. Amberton University has four, ten-week sessions in an academic year: Summer, Fall, Winter, and Spring

Retention is defined by percent of new students who enrolled in the next calendar year after their initial enrollment.

Graduation rate is defined by the number of 2014/2015 new students who completed their degree (BBA/PM or MBA/PM) with Amberton within 8 years.
